 - a. Megan Nedzinski, Jeff Dunham, Richard Faesy, Rich Warren
- 2. Public Comments
 - a. None
- 3. Approve Minutes from 9/9/24
 - a. Megan moved, Jeff seconded
 - b. Approved
- 4. Starksboro Harvest Festival review
 - a. Not heavily attended, but Jeff and Richard engaged with about a dozen interested residents
 - b. Many were interested in audits, particularly free, if available, so we offered EVT's virtual audit services
 - c. Handed out some literature, gave rest to Pete Antos-Ketcham to make available
 - d. Talked with Herb Olson about the Legislature and Andy Young about Robinson School energy issues
 - e. Good thing we were there
 - f. Talked with Pete about the new navigator program
- 5. Community Weatherization Plans
 - a. Rebecca and Pete still haven't checked in about Pete's "energy navigator" role but were planning to before Rebecca leaves
 - b. Coordination with CEAC Navigator Project
 - i. Work in progress to schedule a meeting with the Addison County lead on this effort to review status and do some "training"
 - c. Next Steps
 - i. Meet with the Select Board on November 19, per Rebecca's request
 - ii. Support navigator project with \$4000, what to do with it?
 - 1. Data entry for catching up on ESPM and then engaging monthly to plug in the data
 - a. Intern or someone in town who could be taught how to do it would be a great use for the funds

- b. Initial 5 hours, then 1-2 hours/month
- 2. Mailings for navigator support
- 3. Materials for Pete and navigator
- iii. Hire navigator intern to do the data
- iv. Bring this idea to the Select Board in Nov.
- v. RF reach out to Rebecca to catch up
 - ChargePoint data and continuing access
 - 2. SB preparation
- 6. ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager next steps
 - a. Consider hiring an intern with MERP funds
 - b. Work to find a high school student or member of the community
 - c. No other updates, in a holding pattern until we hear from Rebecca or the Town

 - a. Liaison with Rebecca gone
 - b. Time to provide a report?
 - i. Nov. 19 sometime between 6 and 7 anticipated

- 8. Building Audits and Projects
 - a. Jerusalem Schoolhouse
 - b. Food Shelf
 - c. Reports
 - i. Megan thinks they're really poor, not really worth the wait
 - ii. JS language is inappropriate
 - iii. A little frustration about being off the mark
 - iv. Minimally helpful, but needs to build on them
 - v. Jeff thought they were useful but missed the historical nature of the buildings
 - vi. Negativity about the buildings' usage, missing positivity that they could be used more if they were weatherized and improved
 - vii. RF thinks they are directionally helpful
 - viii. Not enough meat, but ok
 - ix. We see these as stepping stones for moving forward and could be useful if they access grant funds for the town

- x. Need to take some detailed thoughtfulness for moving ahead
- xi. Look at what Tom Perry had done to the Library as a model for the Schoolhouse, but done sensitively to historical nature of the buildings
- xii. These reports support our own findings by the SEC, but the JS uses very little energy because no one uses it now, which could change with improvements
- xiii. Identifies opportunities, directionally correct; weatherization and electrification
- xiv. Encourage the SB to engage the SEC for our expertise in next steps and developing specs for the buildings
- d. Meetinghouse Preschool
 - i. \$500,000 project
 - ii. Received \$350k, but looking for \$150k
 - iii. Fundraising is under way
- e. Robinson School Heat Pump Water Heaters
 - i. RF follow up to see who the new facilities manager is and whether an audit and heat pumps are an option, offer to help for Robinson
- 9. Seeking Other Grants
 - a. Starksboro Library HVAC Project
 - i. No updates on possible grants
 - b. Pavilion Solar Roof or other PV
 - i. 13 kW Town Gap
 - ii. 8 kW Library Electrification Needs
 - iii. No updates on possible grants

 - i. It's all given out and we didn't get any
 - d. MERP
 - i. RF to ask Rebecca for who will be follow up with the request for these funds and next steps
 - ii. Offer to help if grant comes in
